Subject:- Notification for bringing Protective Helmets for two wheelers rider under compulsory certification under Bureau of Indian Standards Act, 2016.

Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, in consultation of Bureau of Indian Standards proposes to issue Helmets (Quality Control) Order, 2018 under the powers conferred under section 16, 17 & 25 of the Bureau of Indian Standards Act, 2016.

2. As per the procedure laid down by the Department of Consumer Affairs vide O.M. No. 6/5/2017-BIS (Pt.) dated 20.03.2018, the proposed Helmets (Quality Control) Order, 2018 is hereby published inviting comments from the general public and the stakeholders for a period of sixty (60) days.

S.O _____ (E).- In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) and (2) of section 16 read with section 17 and sub-section 3 of section 25 of the Bureau of India Standards Act, 2016 (11 of 2016), the Central Government, after consulting the Bureau of India Standards, is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do in the public interest, hereby make the following order, namely:-

1. **Short title and commencement.**- (1) This Order may be called the Helmets (Quality Control) Order, 2018.

(2) It shall come into force with effect from the date.....

2. **Compulsory use of Standards Mark.**- Goods and articles specified in column (1) of the Table shall conform to the corresponding Indian Standard given in column (2) of the Table and shall bear the Standard Mark under a license from the Bureau of Indian Standards as per Scheme-I of Schedule-II of BIS (Conformity Assessment) Regulations 2018.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply in relation to goods and articles as specified in the column (1) of the Table meant for export, which conform to any specification required by the foreign buyer.

3. **Certification and Enforcement Authority.**- In respect of the goods and articles specified in the column (1) of the Table, the Bureau of Indian Standards shall be the certifying and enforcing authority. In addition, an officer not below the rank of General Manager, District Industries Center in Department of Industries of the State Government shall also be the enforcing authority.
